- About 30 children come to our English class and worship time held at our church every Wednesday. Their moms come and stay for the worship time. Most of them come from non-Christian homes.
- More than 15 moms and their babies come to our play date at our church every Tuesday. We read Bible stories and sing praise songs.
- God has opened a door for us to lead the English Bible Study at another local church every Sunday night. There are several adults who are seeking and interested in becoming a believer.
- We are continuing the disaster relief effort by delivering fresh food to more than 200 homes and spending time with them monthly.
- Our mission church on the west coast recently celebrated the baptism of the husband of a church member.
- More and more Japanese friends are asking about our faith. Several of them asked us to spend one-on-one time to study the Bible.
